Participant Liability Waiver, Consent & Camp Agreement

By purchasing tickets and attending the North West Dyslexia Empowerment Camp at Camp Clayton, Ulverstone, I acknowledge that I am providing consent for myself and on behalf of my child. I confirm that I have read, understood, and agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. Acknowledgement of Risks

I understand that participation in activities delivered by Square Pegs Dyslexia Support and Advocacy Inc. ("Square Pegs") and/or Camp Clayton may involve physical, outdoor, recreational, or team-based activities. I acknowledge that these activities carry inherent risks that may result in injury, despite all reasonable precautions being taken by Square Pegs and Camp Clayton. I voluntarily accept these risks for myself and my child.

2. Fitness to Participate

I declare that both my child and I are physically and medically able to reasonably participate in the activities offered. I agree to disclose to Square Pegs any medical, behavioural, physical, or support needs that may affect my child's participation or require additional consideration prior to the camp commencing.

3. Release of Liability

To the extent permitted by law, I release Square Pegs and Camp Clayton from any claims, damages, or losses arising from participation in the North West Dyslexia Empowerment Camp, except where such loss is the result of a wilful act or negligence by Square Pegs or Camp Clayton. This release applies to personal injury, property damage, or other loss that may occur in connection with the camp.

4. Photography, Filming and Media Consent

I give permission for Square Pegs to photograph or film myself and my child during camp activities for use in organisational promotion, advertising, publications, reports, and social media. I understand that:

- I may withdraw this consent at any time by providing written notice to Square Pegs.
- Withdrawal does not apply to materials already published.

5. Camp Rules and Behaviour Expectations

To ensure a safe, respectful, and enjoyable environment for all participants, my child and I agree to:

- Demonstrate empathy, kindness, and respect toward all participants, staff, and volunteers.
- Maintain confidentiality regarding personal stories shared by others.

- Follow evening routines (e.g., lights out times) and respect the sleep needs of all participants.
- Follow all instructions given by Square Pegs volunteers or staff engaged by Square Pegs.
- Ensure that my child remains supervised by me when not participating in organised activities.
- Ensure my child stays with their designated activity group and/or parent/caregiver at all times.
- Not use mobile phones during workshops and scheduled group activities.
- Adhere to Camp Clayton's site rules, including the strict prohibition of alcohol and non-prescription drugs. I understand that substances may be confiscated and/or individuals may be removed from the camp if this rule is breached. I acknowledge that failure to comply with these rules may result in early removal from the camp without refund.

6. Medical Information and Support

I agree to provide all relevant medical and emergency information to Square Pegs prior to the camp, including:

- Diagnosed medical conditions
- Allergy and anaphylaxis information
- Behavioural or support needs
- Medical Action Plans (e.g., asthma, anaphylaxis, epilepsy)

If my child is at risk of anaphylaxis, I will ensure they bring an approved auto-injector device (e.g., EpiPen®) and carry it as required. I understand that Square Pegs volunteers are not able to administer medications for existing medical conditions. Medication management remains my responsibility.

7. Emergency Assistance

In the event of an accident or medical emergency, I authorise Square Pegs to seek appropriate medical assistance for myself or my child, including first aid, ambulance services, or hospital care. I acknowledge that I am responsible for any associated costs.

8. Acknowledgement and Agreement

By purchasing tickets and attending the North West Dyslexia Empowerment Camp, I confirm that:

- I am the parent or legal guardian of the child/children listed during registration.
- I have read and understood this Liability Waiver, Consent, and Camp Agreement.
- I agree to the terms on behalf of myself and my child/children.
- I understand that this agreement applies for the duration of the camp.
